## SCHOOL NEWS

### PRINCIPAL'S PERSPECTIVE

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

In the past few weeks our students have been showing why we have such a great school. Our students have been striving in a wide variety of activities across the school. Studies plainly show that one of the key factors in people learning new skills and becoming highly accomplished is sustained focus and effort.

The Primary Choir have certainly this type of effort and focus as they put together their audition for the NSW Schools Spectacular. The Schools Spectacular gathers students from across NSW to perform together in music, dance and singing. Anyone who has seen the Schools Spectacular recognises the talent of the students involved and the professionalism of the production. It is great that our students are putting themselves forward to audition for such an auspicious event. Over the last few weeks the choir has put in endless hours of practice as they prepared to make their audition video. They have created a wonderful audition piece and we will learn soon whether they have made it into the Schools Spectacular. Whether or not the choir are chosen to perform, we are very proud of their efforts and the quality of their performance.

Similarly, seven students from Oaklands Central School represented our zone in the Riverina Region Swimming Championships. Getting to the Regional Championships is a huge effort and shows the real talent of our swimmers. The seven students who represented Oaklands and the zone were Halle Robb, Chelcee Doyle, Zak Sartore, Wade Bateman for Primary and Bryce Kenny, Crystal Bateman and Jacob Glanvill for

Secondary. We are very proud of these students and their achievements. One student, Wade Bateman, won his event at region and now has earned the right to represent Riverina at the NSW Swimming Championships in Sydney. Congratulations Wade!

On Friday, the SRC organised a highly successful "Funky Hair" Day at Oaklands Central School. The day saw students and staff come to school sporting some creative and some colourful hairdos. A special mention to Mr Bobbin who even had his hair specially cut for the occasion. While it was a fun day at school, the day has a serious side. Funky Hair Day is a nationwide event to raise money to support medical research into leukaemia. Our school was able to raise \$125.00 to support this worthwhile cause. It also shows our SRC's commitment to raising money to support important community causes.

- Student focussed learning goals in each class to address the learning needs of each student



Students have several assessment tasks which they should be working on at home at the moment. Please ensure your student is keeping a home study routine and if you are concerned they lack the understanding to successfully complete a task please encourage them to talk to their teacher for clarification and to present draft copies of work for feedback. Feedback is an essential part of the learning process so encourage students to have conversations about their learning.

Enjoy the truck show this weekend. I'd encourage all students to attend and to get involved in this community event that displays the rich diversity of people and opportunity this community offers.

I look forward to meeting Year 6 to Year 7 parents at our information BBQ on Monday evening at 6:30 pm. 




