In contrast, individuals with a growth mindset believe that they can develop their intelligence over time. Learning is boundless and like a muscle- it continues to strengthen the more it is used.

I ask that you encourage and support developing the growth mindsets of our students. True success comes with application and always seeking to improve through effective feedback. If your hear 'I can't do it', add 'yet'. Changing the way we talk can make a huge difference to our own mindsets.



Talking mental health awareness from a "lived experience" perspective

Drana Local Health Advisory Committee and Federation Council with support of Murrumbidgee PHN, Partners in Recovery program are fortunate to have been able to engage Patrick Lawson to speak with our local community about the importance of saying the 3 Words "I Need Help" before he begins his National tour "Here 2 Help" later this month.

Patrick Lawson and "3 words. I Need Help"

Patrick Lawson (Corowa) realised very quickly, through his own personal experience, how hard it is for people to reach out and use the 3 words - *I Need Help*. Patrick started a Facebook page "3 Words. I Need Help" as a support network for fellow depression and mental health sufferers and their support people.

The page has received a great response, with members reaching out and helping each other by sharing stories, feelings and creating a network with no stigma attached - a safe place. The "3 words" page is now followed internationally by over 4300 people.

Patrick's facebook page attracted the attention of American film maker and author Kevin Hines resulting in Patrick being selected to assist with an Australian film project to raise suicide prevention and mental health awareness on a greater level.

Patrick will share his personal story and how raising awareness for suicide prevention and helping others has helped him come through a very dark period in his life.

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
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

We welcome Jacqueline Robertson serving the Oaklands Central School community. Jacqueline works on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Our Chaplain works alongside the learning and support team to facilitate the wellbeing of our students and their families. Our Chaplain runs approved programs that build children's emotional resilience, personal awareness and social capabilities.

Our Chaplain is a caring and approachable presence in the school, providing a listening ear and a source of comfort and referral for those in a difficult time or in need of a friend.

Our Chaplain is available to meet with students and other members of the school community to provide support and guidance regarding relationships, wellbeing, choices, values and spiritual matters following the written permission from a parent or guardian.

All students and their families are able to make an appointment during the school term. To find out more or to make a referral please contact our Chaplain on the school number or in person.

What does a Chaplain do?

A Chaplain is an additional support for school communities to assist with the social, emotional and spiritual wellbeing of their students.

Chaplains are able to run specific programs tailored to the needs of the school such as social skills, grief and loss, resilience building and anti-bullying. Chaplains also provide one-on-one care, mentoring and support for students, parents and staff. Chaplains network with the local community to provide a broad range of support services to the school.

School Chaplains:

- Work with Learning Support or Welfare Team to facilitate student wellbeing
- Provide pastoral care for students, staff and the wider school community
- Facilitate small group programs and one-on-one meetings with students
- Facilitate lunch time activities to assist students in building healthy relationships
- Network with welfare services, local churches and other agencies in the local community to provide a broad range of support services to the school
- Facilitate groups, events and activities to support spiritual wellbeing with voluntary student participation
- Build mentoring relationships and assist students with goal setting
- Support staff at school camps, excursions and other activities as required
