PRINCIPAL'S PERSPECTIVE

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Last Wednesday the school community gathered to commemorate Colin Little, his contribution to our school and his part in our lives. There were many touching stories and memories shared about Colin, as well as reflections on what made him so well respected, during the events held on Wednesday. At the end of the ceremonies we unveiled our ongoing tribute as the GA Shed was renamed "Colin's Shed" and a sign placed in his honour. Later in the year a plaque will also be placed near the shed.

At our whole school assembly last Wednesday, we were able to see the way our students continue to shine their light in a variety of ways. Secondary and Primary students represented the school at zone carnivals in the previous week and all our students "did us proud". Staff commented on how every one of our students that represented Oaklands behaved wonderfully and put in their absolute best effort. Doing your best is all that we can ask of anyone. AG EXCURSION

Stage 4 and 5 Agricultural class journeyed to The Fisheries Department on the Sturt Highway close to Narrandera. Our purpose was to explore the agricultural diversity we have in Australia. Many farm dams are stocked with breeding fish and even complete farms have turned entirely to the Aquaculture Enterprise.

We soon discovered the importance of such a facility in terms of building fish stocks to our major waterways, keeping check on native fish health, evaluating future trends in fish stocks and employing safe and effective measures in controlling diseases and pests. By the way, the only other similar facility is way up in Queensland.

Our team discovered that Mr John Lake was the instigator in establishing such research in Australia. Mr Lake was a pioneer in research and breeding native fish. Mr Lake established the research facilities to breed Murray Cod, Silver Perch, Golden Perch and Catfish - the major inland angling species.

Our students couldn't resist meeting up with Agro (the 25 year plus Murray Cod) in the display tank. Other fish on show include

Golden and Macquarie Perch, Catfish and Trout.

The fisheries arranged a talk by a 20 year old graduate who explained the avenues of becoming involved with Aquaculture studies and employment. Not only this but the Research farm gave us Freshwater display chart and booklets on how to manage your fishing.

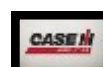
