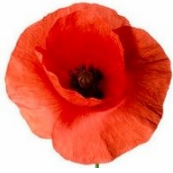
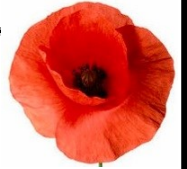

## SCHOOL NEWS

### PRINCIPAL'S PERSPECTIVE

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Oaklands Central School is a key part of the Oaklands Community. We understand the need for our students to grow so that they fully participate in community life, appreciate the importance of our community, its values and its traditions. In the second week of the school holidays students from Oaklands joined with the wider community in the ANZAC commemoration. The students marched as part of the town parade and then joined in the ceremony at the Oaklands Commemorative Garden. The participation of so many students is something we can all be proud of. All the students showed great respect for the sacrifices made by our service men and women who gave, and continue to give, so that every Australian can enjoy our wonderful way of life. Thank you to all the students and staff who participated in ANZAC Day at Oaklands.

It has been great to witness how every student has arrived back at school full of enthusiasm

for learning at the start of term 2. Since the start of term, I have had numerous students keen to show me the fantastic learning they have been doing in class. Students regularly stop me to talk about their learning and what they have been achieving in class. They are excited to demonstrate the things they are doing and how much they are improving. It is one of the real privileges of working in our school, seeing our students making such wonderful progress in their literacy and numeracy. Every student has started the term working with their teacher to write their SMART goal for the next 5 weeks. In literacy we are focussing on the Super6 skill of monitoring. This requires students to note key ideas, concepts that need more explanation, key words and other important features as they read texts. More information about this will be made available soon. Every student is also involved in a school wide reading program. If you have any questions about your child's learning please feel free to talk to their teacher.

Each year our students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the NAPLAN tests. This year is a little different as Oaklands Central School has

been included in the NAPLAN Online program. Students will sit the majority of their tests using a computer and adaptive technologies. In simple terms this means that the questions in the test will be responsive to student answers. The system is designed to more accurately reflect student progress and to make the test more user friendly. It is always important to remember that NAPLAN is designed to be a diagnostic test that gives standardized information about the skills, knowledge and understanding that students have. This information is used, along with lots of other data at school, to plan the best teaching programs for our students. NAPLAN is only one data source. In a small school such as Oaklands our professional teaching staff know our students and their learning needs very well. It is important for every student to attend each day that NAPLAN is being run and for every student to do their very best so we have good data. However, it is simply a test and students should not be anxious or stress about their results. If your child is anxious about the tests please reassure them and let the school know so we can support them through the test process.

As we start term 2 there are a few reminders for parents and carers. It is important that students attend school every day. The research is clear, any student who has more than 5 school days off during a year can experience a large

impact on learning. While it is important that if your child is sick they stay home until they recover, it is important for your child that they are at school. If they cannot attend please let the office know either by text message, using the absence note or calling the school. As winter approaches there will be cold days when students should "rug up" to keep warm in the playground. If they don't have a school jacket please make sure they are dressed in a plain jacket, preferably maroon or red in colour. If your child can't be in uniform please remember to send a note in to the school with an explanation.

As our school motto says, this term is a chance for every student to "let your light shine"!

## HEAD TEACHER NEWS

Welcome all to Term 2 for 2018.

While we have only been back for a week and a half, learning is well underway and students are on task with new SMART goals and working towards improving their literacy and numeracy skills. We have a very busy term ahead of us with numerous sporting events and extra-curricular opportunities.

### Stage 4/5 Assessments

At the beginning of term students were reminded of the assessment schedules and policy that was published in a booklet last term. Students should be given two weeks' notice for upcoming assessments. If they have a valid reason for handing in a task late, they need to make contact with the teacher at least two days before the due date and provide relevant paperwork. For each day late, students will lose 10% of the issued marks. For students who are more than 5 days late with a task and no valid reason, a warning letter will be sent home. As parents and carers, if you have not yet seen the assessment copy, please ask your child or contact the school for an additional copy.

### Work Education class work experience

As part of the Stage 5 Work Education class, students have been undertaking weekly work experience places. Currently Victoria is working

with the Federation Council preschool in Oaklands, Connor is working in the workshop at Days Logistics and Britney is working on Wayne Durnan's property as a farmhand. Students are gaining such valuable experience from these workplaces. On behalf of the school, thank you to these businesses for their ongoing commitment, supporting our future workforce.

### NAPLAN and Year 12 Half Yearly Examinations

Throughout Weeks 3-4, students in Years 7 and 9 will be participating in the online NAPLAN testing. It is a time for students to focus and use their strategies to do the best they can. But also to remember, as stated in a well-known letter about NAPLAN, 'This test does not assess all of what makes each of you exceptional and unique'.

Throughout Week 3 our Year 12 students will be sitting their half yearly examinations in the hall. Best wishes to Taylah and Violet as they prepare over this week and revise over the content covered so far in their courses.

### Reading and Writing

After discussing the benefits and growth seen in students after completing the reading and writing program in Term 1, we are now moving towards 20 minute sessions at the start of the day. We are finding that more students are borrowing from the library and beginning to

read more complex text. Furthermore, students are developing their abilities to process their thoughts for writing and are producing longer, more structured pieces. Are you seeing any changes at home? Feel free to share if you are!

### **SMART Goals**

Students in Stage 4/5 developed their SMART Goals on Tuesday last week. The focus for the following five weeks is on developing literacy skills associated with 'Understanding text'. Students used the progressions to track what skills they already used well and looked at where to next. Please discuss your child's SMART goal with them and provide opportunities at home for them to further develop in the area.

A big thankyou to students and their parents for attending and supporting our local ANZAC service. Our school students provide such a valuable role on the day and help to ensure future generations understand the importance

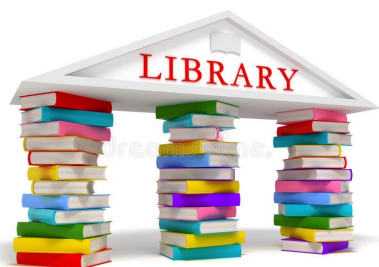
### **PREMIER'S SPORTING CHALLENGE**

Experience is unnecessary as training will be provided.

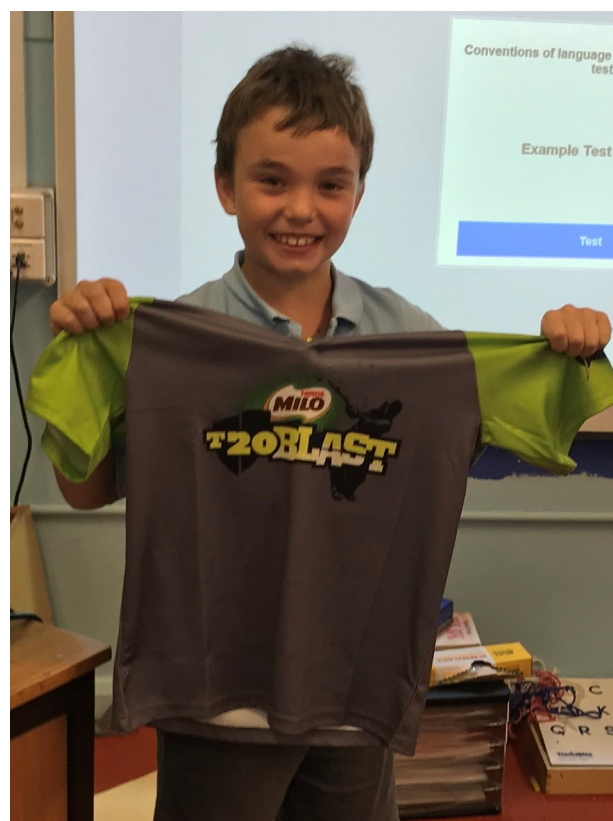
