Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Recently I have had the opportunity to reflect on the achievements of our students in literacy and numeracy. The data on student achievement over time is very exciting. I have often stated that our core purpose at school is learning and we need a strong focus on literacy and numeracy. At Oaklands Central School, we have always seen strong year by year growth in students as measured by NAPLAN. Over the last 4 years, we are also seeing that students are building their literacy and numeracy skills. More and more of our students are achieving in the top bands and the average scores of students are climbing. Key measures show a continual upward trend showing, what the statisticians call "value adding" for our students. In simple terms it means that our students are shining their lights in literacy and numeracy. This is an achievement that we can all celebrate.

Last week our teachers gathered for a professional learning evening. As part of that evening, we participated in bush fire preparedness the training. Given unprecedented start to the fire season this training is extremely timely. The school is well prepared for the fire season. We have procedures in place while our students and staff are well trained in emergency and

evacuation procedures. As we live in an environment where there is a real bush fire threat, it is important that everyone in our community is bush fire aware and has an emergency plan. While we all hope that we don't have to face fires, it is always good to be prepared. I would also like to acknowledge and thank all our SES, fire and support services who work so hard to keep others safe during emergencies.

The last two weeks have been busy, with students shining their lights in really impressive ways. At Grandparents Day all of our students recited poetry in front of a large audience. As I have noted before, this is very challenging for most people and I am really proud of our students for the way they performed on the day. Thank you to all our staff who so actively support our students to be brave and perform for our community. Thank you also to everyone from our friends, families and community who came along to share the morning and support our students. We really appreciate so many people being part of our school.

Our stage 5 students are continuing their work placement and TAFE experience each Wednesday. It has been wonderful seeing them grow their confidence and their skills as they participate in this program which builds their work readiness skills. We have already seen students gain part-time work through this program. Our SRC students participated in a camp this week where they were able to continue building their leadership skills as a group. One of our great strengths is the leadership of our students. I hear that the camp was really enjoyed by all the students.

Finally, I would like to thank Mr Stuart Jones for his great service to the school. Sadly Stuart has finished at the school as our GA and is taking up other work opportunities. His cheerful manner and highly skilled workmanship will be missed at Oaklands Central School.
