Have a great fortnight.

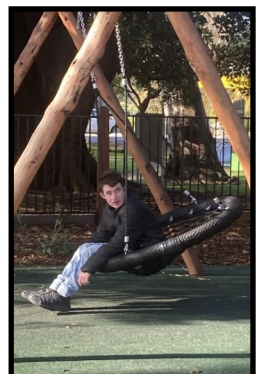

On Monday 27th June Year 5/6 students went on an excursion to the Bonegilla Migrant Experience to learn about migrants that came to Australia after World War 2. We visited because we had been learning about it in History this term. We got to explore the old, heritage cabins, bathrooms and the kitchen to experience what it was like to live there as migrants. We also looked at a wall of plaques of people who lived there. We saw a monument that was made to resemble the arrival of migrants who came to Australia. It represented people leaving home, going on a journey via a six-week boat trip to Australia and entering a new life in a foreign country.

There was also a cooking workshop where we learned to tie sausages, make butter by hand (the hard way!) and also made freshly squeezed orange juice. To make the butter we started off with thickened cream, then put it in a jar and started shaking it until it turned to butter. To make the orange juice, we had to juice the oranges with a juicer, then we poured it into a cup. Then we settled down and had a sausage sizzle with our freshly made butter and our previously made sausages. We enjoyed the tour and were grateful we were able to go to the migrant camp. Our favourite parts were looking at the rooms and wall plaques and the cooking workshop.

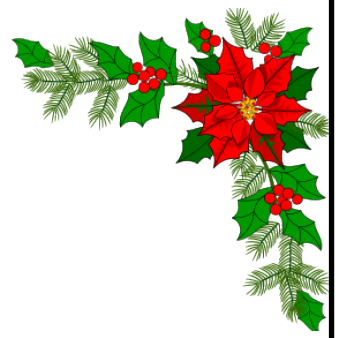

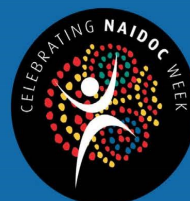

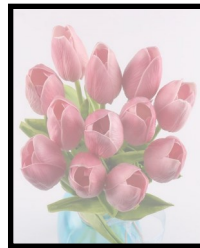
