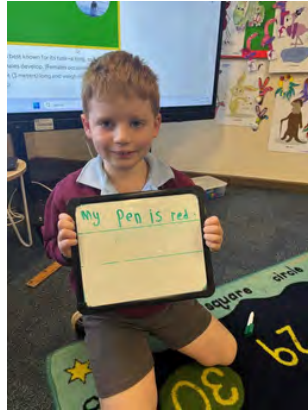

Kindergarten have been working hard on using their knowledge of sounds to read short texts and write sentences. They are sounding out words and learning to use capital letters and full stops.



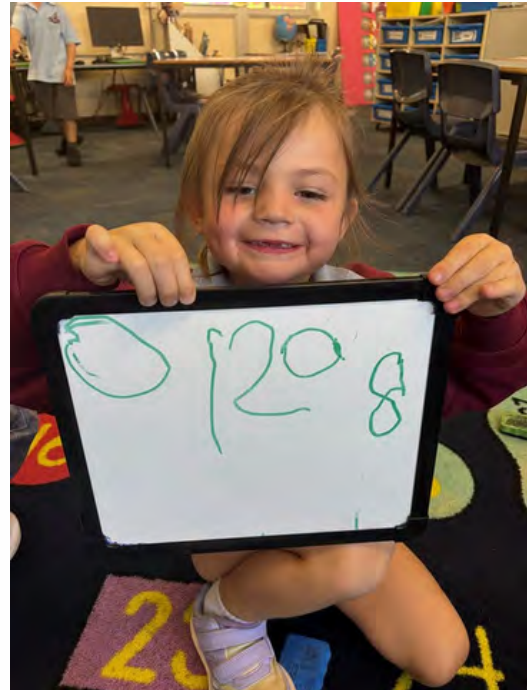
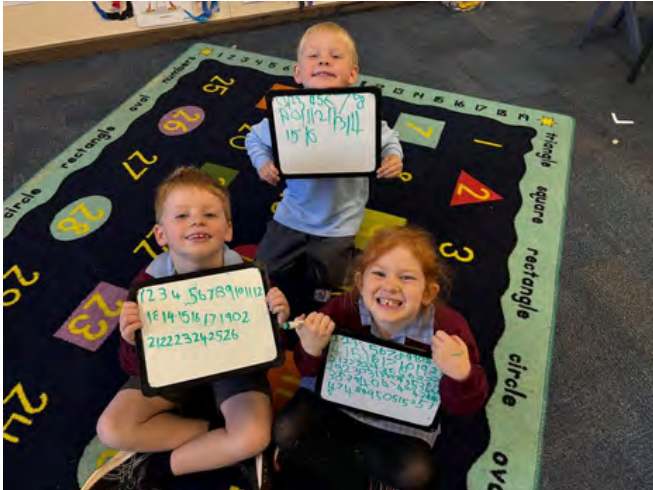

The class worked so well together in creating our Assembly item. Year 3 supported the Kindergartens when making animations and encouraged them to be confident when acting out their parts.



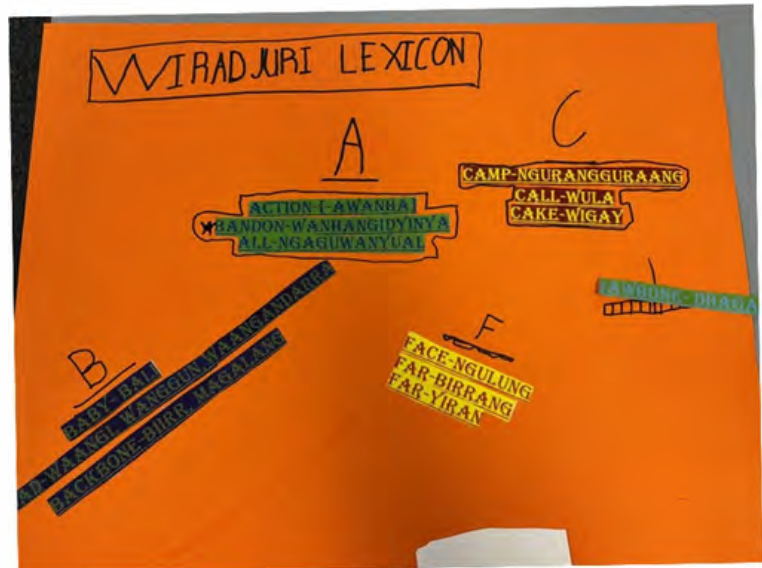

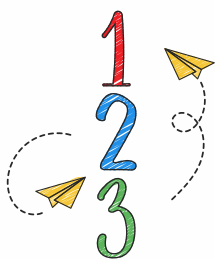
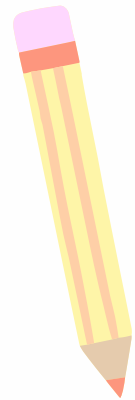

Hello! I'm Jade Winter – your School Psychologist.

I'm a registered psychologist with a passion for student wellbeing and creating fair, inclusive school systems. I come out to the school on an ad hoc basis, where I can offer consultation and advice to schools staff and families, short term counselling and Educational Assessments. My goal is to support the adults around students so that young people feel safe, understood, and ready to learn.



I've worked across a range of settings including NSW and Victorian Education, private practice, and Family and Community Services. I have a demonstrated history of working with vulnerable children, young people, and their families, and I'm skilled in developmental trauma, attachment, school attendance challenges, acute risk assessment, anxiety and low mood.

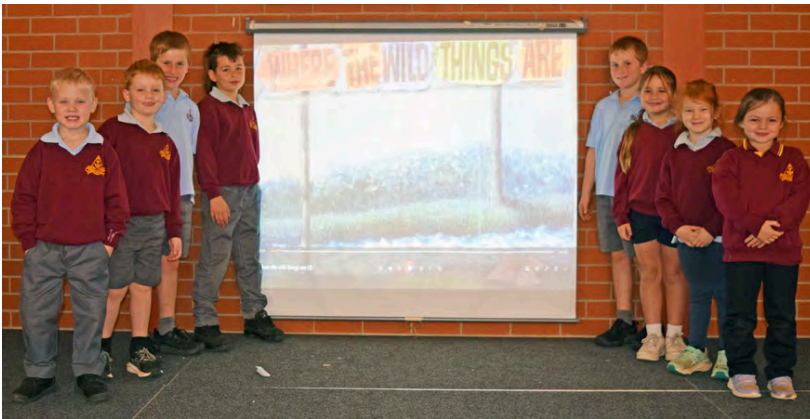
My practice draws on a range of evidence-based approaches, including Acceptance and Commitment Therapy (ACT), Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT), Motivational Interviewing, Solution Focused Therapy, Dialectical Behaviour Therapy (DBT) and Educational Assessments. Where needed, I also assist families in connecting with external services and supports.

At the heart of my work is a deep belief that all children deserve access to equitable and high-quality psychological support – and that schools play a key role in making that a reality.

- The highlight of May was the 103rd Annual General Meeting and NSW State Conference held at Wagga Wagga
- Aside from motions, there were outstanding guest speakers, beginning with Cr Dallas Tout, Mayor of Wagga Wagga who welcomed us. Dr Joe McGirr MP opened the conference. Sarah Wheeler spoke of her Outback Long Ride (after losing both her parents close together) and the Foundation “A Daughter’s Way” she founded to raise funds and awareness of gastrointestinal cancer. We also heard from Isabella Suttie, singer with her amazing operatic voice at only 14 yrs of age. Isabella is a local girl.
- The agenda was packed with forty-four motions up for discussion. Agricultural & Environmental, Education, Health & Social Security, Transport & Telecommunications, Miscellaneous, Association Business all for offer.
- One stand-out motion Passed “That the policy of CWA of NSW be to advocate for the provision of best practice baby health services, including accessible and well-resourced clinics, to support the health and development of infants and young children across NSW”. We were reminded of the value of Baby Health Centres particularly the centre in our own towns ie, Oaklands.
- Locally, CWA SUNDAY was celebrated by Murray Group with a service at St Matthew’s Albury. Father MacLeod-Miller gave a sermon on the service provided by CWA of NSW, and praised the work we have done over 103 years, to improve the lives of women and children, and society generally.
- Afterwards the congregation moved to historic Adamhurst Mansion for morning tea. Adamhurst is an iconic Albury building, having many roles since its’ beginnings as a private home in 1880. The Airforce took over the site in 1944. From 1947-1977 it was home to Albury High School Girls’ Hostel. 1978-2004 NSW Health Commission used Adamhurst as a Rehabilitation and Day Care Centre. 2006 Betty and Muriel’s restaurant. 2007 Adamhurst Restaurant and Function Centre. 2013 The building was purchased by the family of Father Peter MacLeod-Miller and his mother Sandra. Adamhurst remains a special place in Albury’s history, an artistic and cultural hub. Following intensive restoration containing volumes of historical treasures.
